## Welcome to FENERBAHCE S.K.

**From A. V. ALEXANDER**

**CITY CHAIRMAN**



"Tonight we all sample one of the prizes and tests of our Championship success of last season . . . European football. This has become one of the necessities of achievement for a club like ours, aiming as we do to supply our supporters with the opportunities of seeing the best players and the best competitions. Although this is a new venture for us, the City of Manchester was the first representative from England in the European Cup—and that of course was our great rivals and friends Manchester United. It is unwise to predict and to hope for too much in this game. We cannot be the first English club to win the European Cup but we can become the first European City to have two clubs as winners.

That, of course does not make light of our first visitors for tonight, our opening night in European football. The FENERBAHCE club of Turkey are distinguished representatives of their Country and of football. Last season they won five competitions. Tonight we are delighted to welcome Club Officials, Players and supporters to Maine Road. And we hope they will be the first of many foreign clubs to be seen here in serious competition and in friendship."

# CITY NEWS

The veteran French footballer, Gabriel Hanot—and the Parisian sports paper he worked for—*L'Equipe*—really started something when they had an idea about getting clubs who have won their National Championships to fight out a championship of their own.

That idea is now the major club tournament in the world and the 1968-69 version kicks off here tonight at Maine Road. The European Cup has been dominated by Spain, won by Italians, and the Portuguese and now Britain has had the Cup in its possession for two years.

And tonight almost every Englishman is a City supporter as the club takes on its first representative responsibility as the National Champions. But if you think winning the First Division championship is a responsibility then Fenerbahce are weighed down with successes of last season.

They won then the National League championship, the Turkish Cup, the Football Pool Cup, the Presidency Cup and the Balkan Cup. In the sixty-one years since they were formed they have been amateur and professional—with quite a string of honours: eleven times amateur champions of Istanbul, six times champions of the National League, five times won the Istanbul Cup, five times the Istanbul Shield. Then on to the professional league championship—five times, the Cup once and the Presidency Cup once. If this is the story of 61 years then last season was a historic one for them.

Of the players in the squad tonight the best known in Turkey are Yavuz Simsek, the goalkeeper, who has nine international caps; the right-back Sukru Birant, 24 caps; the centre-half Ercan Aktuna, 19 times an international; the captain and right-half is Seref Has, with 48 caps; Ion Nunweiler has captained the Ru-

manian National side 41 times; and inside-forward Can Barta has played for Venezia, Fiorentina and Lazio in Italy.

But after an outstanding season they began the new one uncertainly in league matches and against specially selected foreign opposition. There's something familiar about that story.

**Done it:** A City supporter, D. E. Eccles, of Amberley Road, Macclesfield not unaturally called in on the Fenerbahce Stadium when he was in Turkey on holiday recently. Language difficulties were overcome with the aid of a City programme. The team weren't at the ground then, the groundsman explained. They train over the other side of the Bosphorus, in Asian Turkey. Two photographs kindly sent by Mr. Eccles show a ground which holds about 40,000—on the edge of the Bosphorus—although he did point out that it seems possible to get a look at games there from higher ground round the stadium.

**Extra:** Apart from their football stadium, Fenerbahce have facilities for athletics, basketball, volleyball, a covered gymnasium, a yachting club, a guest house and a camping site. They also have table tennis, wrestling, judo, weight-lifting and rowing facilities.

**The Band:** As part of the European occasion tonight the Danish Elsinore Girls band is putting on a marching display here at Maine Road. The band consists of girls aged 12 to 17, apart from the Captain who is 23. It was formed ten years ago and is good enough and popular enough to be entirely self-supporting. Their display here is part of an eight day programme in Manchester, the first city they have visited in Britain—yet another first.

**Luck of the Irish?** Mr. and Mrs. Gibbons, parents of amateur David Gibbons told the manager that City were sure to break the lean scoring spell against Huddersfield last week as they had made the trip from Belfast for the game. There's been a move to bring them over from Ireland for tonight's game.

# CITY'S FIRST EUROPEAN CHALLENGE

What chance have City of winning the European Champions Clubs' Cup at the first attempt? Well, if tradition is any guide then they must be quite slight. Apart from the opening competition, when Real Madrid began their reign of glory, only two clubs have won the trophy at the first attempt—Inter-Milan (1964) and Celtic (1967). And both of those had had four previous cracks at the other two big competitions—and failed—before they took the top crown.

Benfica, winners in 1961 and 1962, were knocked out in the preliminary round of their first tournament in 1957-58: A.C. Milan, kings of Europe in 1963, and our neighbours Manchester United, current Champions, both made three abortive attempts before they succeeded.

It is clear that experience counts for an awful lot in European competition today: if City do manage to win the trophy then our performance would go down as one of the finest in the history of European tournaments.

This is the first time a British city has had two entrants in the European Champions Clubs' Cup, though this has happened several times in other countries. Real Madrid and Atletico Madrid competed together in 1958-59 and 1966-67: Benfica and Sporting Lisbon joined forces in 1961-62 and the following season; while A.C. Milan and Inter-Milan made a dual challenge in 1963-64.

And on four of those five occasions one club reached the final! Only in 1966-67,

when Real failed at the quarter final stage and Atletico went at round one, did a dual attempt fail completely.

But there has as yet been only one occasion when city clubs have clashed in this competition—in 1959 Atletico took Real to three games in the semi-final before losing 3-1.

One of the biggest victories in the Champions Cup was recorded in Manchester 12 years ago. Manchester United ran up a 10-0 success over Anderlecht; this was later equalled by Ipswich (10-0 v. Floriana of Malta in 1962-63) and Benfica (10-0 v. Stade Dudelange of Luxembourg in 1965-66). By winning the other leg 8-0, Benfica established the greatest-ever aggregate victory of 18-0 over Dudelange. Best away victory was Anderlecht's 10-1 win at Valkeakosken in Finland during 1966-67.

Six players have hit five goals in one match and the highest individual scorer in any season was Altafini (A.C. Milan) with 14 in 1962-63. Last season Eusebio (Benfica) became the only man ever to lead European Cup scorers outright on two occasions—in 1965-66 he hit 7, last season he was top with 6.

A further reminder of the importance of winning tonight—only once in the entire history of the competition has a club losing the first-leg on its own ground ever won the tie. That was in the first round of the first competition in 1955-56 when A.C. Milan were beaten 4-3 at home by Saarbrücken but won the return 4-1.

# TALKING POINT . . .

when a City man puts his point of view

## ★ Tonight: Team manager Joe Mercer

We have played foreign teams on tours, in friendly matches, in representative matches and at club level, tonight we begin European competition in earnest. And it's nice to be giving this sort of football a send-off at home.

European competition presents new problems for us practically—the home and away tie, the change and extremes of atmosphere, playing surface and temperament.

You can only gather experience of these things by playing this sort of football. It is an exciting prospect for us.

But there is another problem which teams like ours competing in European Football must conquer. It's one that has appeared in the game more frequently . . . It's the problem of retaliation and tough play. And I regard this as another tactical exercise for us.

The clash of temperament, the prizes at stake—status more than money—present difficulties to the players and referee. But the authorities have made it quite plain that they intend to punish severely players who come before them. And I believe they will.

I think you'll agree that our players have conducted themselves well on the field lately under some provocation I might say. Fenerbahce, I am told, pride themselves on their own reputation. For both of us, then, I hope this won't be a big problem, and may we see a truly sporting game to fit the occasion.

# FENERBAHCE S.K. Turkey

Fenerbahce, seventeen times Champions of Turkey, make their fifth excursion into the European Champion Clubs' Cup tonight but they have yet to progress beyond the first round. They have won only one tie, that being in the preliminary round of their first venture in 1959/60 when they beat Csepel Budapest 3-2 away after drawing 1-1 in Istanbul.

Yet in Turkey, Fenerbahce are one of the country's star sides. They have 16 full international players on their staff at the moment and, in fact, since Turkey played her first international match in 1923—when there were seven Fenerbahce players in the line-up—there have been less than a dozen occasions when the national team has performed without a player from this club.

The club was formed in 1907 and initially won the Istanbul championship in 1912—the first of 11 successes in this competition. Since the adoption of professionalism in 1952, Fenerbahce—together with Besiktas and Galatasaray, also of Istanbul—have virtually controlled the destiny of the major trophies in very much the same manner as Celtic and Rangers command affairs in Scotland at the moment. No one else gets a look in.

The three clubs from the capital last season once again took the first three places in the table:

One of the key men behind Fenerbahce's outstanding successes of the past decade is Ignace Molnar, one-time national coach of Hungary and Bulgaria who is now in his third spell in charge of Fenerbahce. Acknowledged as the top coach in the country, Molnar has had coaching experience in many European countries.

On the field one of their outstanding players is 32-year-old club captain Seref Has, a veteran of 48 internationals for Turkey. Seref originally made his name as a winger or centre-forward but it was the wisdom of Molnar, who transformed him into such a brilliant half-back, which has enabled him to remain one of his country's top personalities for so long.

Seref is the club's level top scorer, with three goals, in European Cup ties—the same number as Can Bartu, another big name in Turkey. Can first played for the Turkish national side when he was 19 and for much of his earlier career he was in two minds whether to take up soccer as a profession or to remain true to his love, as an amateur, for basketball. Fortunately, he chose football and later he spent six years in Italian football with Fiorentina, Lazio and Venezia. If he's on form tonight, we may well be in for a treat from this tall, elegant inside-forward with the deadly shot.

Can, incidentally, made headlines in another direction in 1960 when he "forgot" to report for national service on the appointed day and he

was sentenced to 100 days in the glasshouse!

Centre-half Ion Nunweiller is a Rumanian international (41 caps), but the remainder of the club's men who have been capped won them for Turkey. The possible line-up for tonight is:

So Fenerbahce have lost their last nine European ties away from home, though they have only twice been beaten on their own soil. Clear indication, then, that City's prospects of progress in our first venture into

Europe's number one tournament will depend very much upon our performance at Maine Road tonight. A two-goal lead will probably be sufficient though it may not be easy to obtain.
